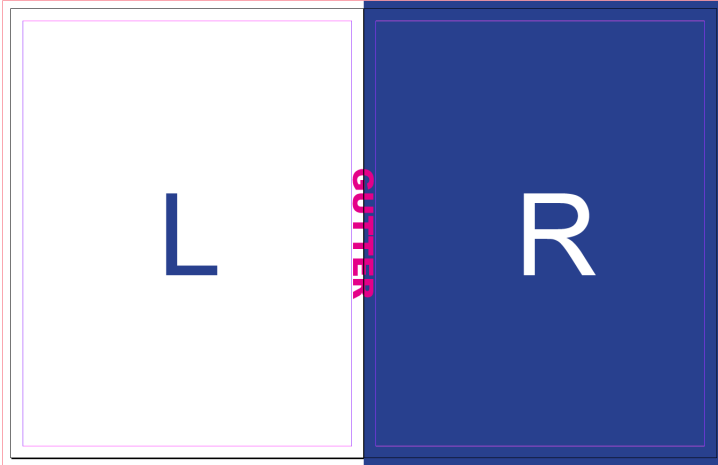


# InDesign Gutter Margin Preview

InDesign PDFs may display a sliver of the adjoining page in the gutter margin. This may look odd in proofs, but files will print as built. Settings can be modified to remove this feature.

## InDesign Spread Sample

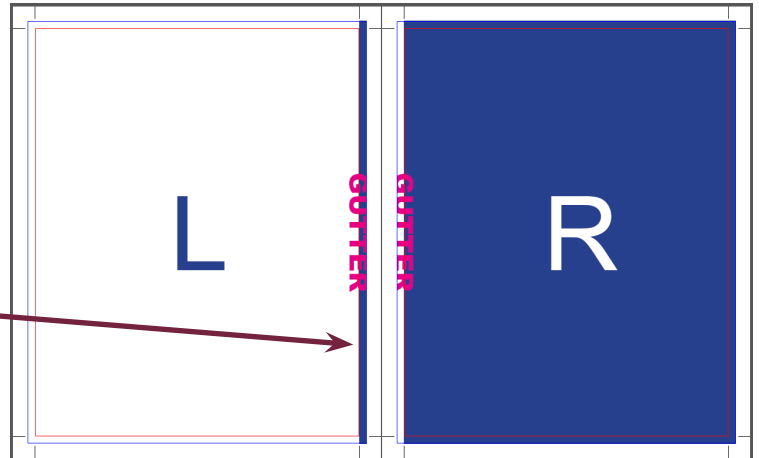


Set up as **Facing Pages** in **Document Setup**

Left hand page is blank

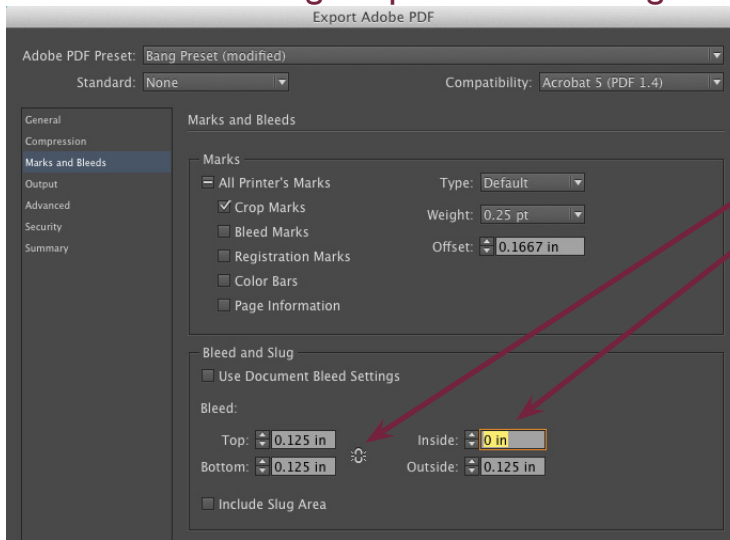
Right hand page has a solid blue background

## PDF Two Page Spread View - Default Settings



InDesign **Export > Marks and Bleed** settings for print may include **a sliver of the adjoining page** to indicate how the spread pages line up

## Modified InDesign Export Bleed Settings



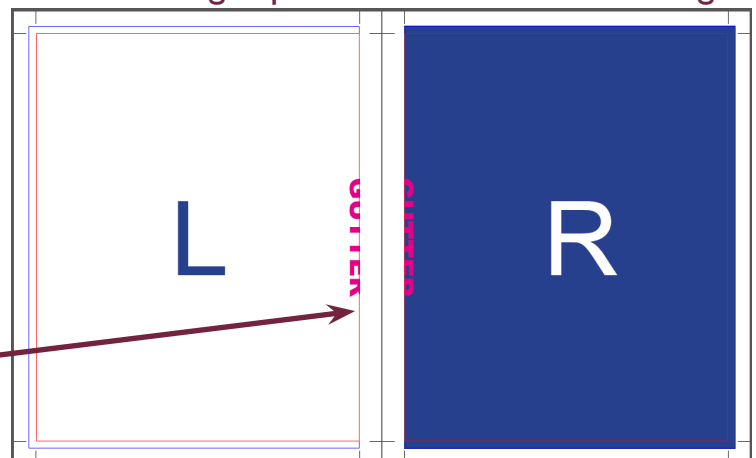
To omit the gutter margin preview:

Under **Export > Marks and Bleeds** tab,

● **Bleed** settings *must* be unlinked and then

● **Inside** bleed margin set to zero

## PDF Two Page Spread View - Modified Settings



Modified settings maintain bleed on all outer margins

The gutter margin is now flush with final trim
